- 1. A Pecuniary Gift
- 2. A Non-Monetary Gift
- 3. A Residuary Gift
- 4. A Reversionary Gift

Brief definition of each form:

- 1. A Pecuniary Gift: A pecuniary is most likely the simplest and most popular form of legacy. You will be able to leave a specific sum of money to a specific beneficiary.
- 2. A Non-Monetary Gift: non-monetary gift is not cash but it still is valuable such as: property, stocks, works of art, copyright revenues or any other valuable items.
- 3. A Residuary Gift: A residuary gift is related to the residual value of your estate once you have paid all debts. You can divide residuary estate between several beneficiaries.
- 4. A Reversionary Gift: The Reversionary gift can be given after your main beneficiary has transitioned. For Example: If you leave estate to your son, when he passes it will be bequeathed to Palace Of Peace.
